September 18, 2007

A. ROLL CALL/POSTING OF AGENDA

At 5:30 p.m., the regular meeting of the Oxnard City Council convened in the Council Chambers. Councilmembers Thomas E. Holden, Dean Maulhardt, John C. Zaragoza, Andres Herrera and Timothy B. Flynn were present. The Deputy City Clerk stated that the agenda was posted on Thursday in the Library and City Clerk's Office. Mayor Holden presided and called the meeting to order. Staff members present were: Edmund F. Sotelo, City Manager; Grace Hoffman, Deputy City Manager; Gary L. Gillig, City Attorney; and Lourdes A. Lopez, Deputy City Clerk.

C. CLOSED SESSION

At 5:30 p.m. the City Council recessed to a closed session, pursuant to Government Code section 54956.9(a), to confer with its attorneys. The title and case number of the litigation discussed is Lindholm v. Gillig, Ventura County Superior Court Case No. 56-2007-00303040-CU-WM-VTA.

The City Council also recessed to a closed session, pursuant to Government Code section 54957.6, to give instructions to its negotiators, Dennis Scala, Special Assistant to the City Manager, Lino Corona, Acting Human Resources Director, and Lynn Hutton, Human Resources Manager, regarding the salaries, salary schedules or compensation paid in the form of fringe benefits for employees represented by the International Association of Firefighters AFL-CIO (IAFF), Local 1684, the Service Employees International Union (SEIU), Local No. 998, the Oxnard Peace Officers' Association (OPOA), and the Oxnard Public Safety Management Employees Association (OPSMEA), and other matters within the scope of representation.

The City Manager commented on: 1) the upcoming presentation of Peter Neff at the Oxnard Public Library on September 25th on film scoring; 2) Police Officer Michael Purdy being awarded the medal of honor; and 3) the new edition to downtown Oxnard, Barroco's Restaurant, known for their organic homemade cuisine and bakery.

R. STUDY SESSION

Development Services Department

1. SUBJECT: Pre-Application Review (PZ 07-600-7) for Development of a Shopping Center with Ancillary Alcohol Sales at the Southwest Corner of Gonzales Road and Rose Avenue (APN 215-0-061-125), Filed by Michael Penrod, Parkstone Companies. (130)  
RECOMMENDATION: Review and provide preliminary comments on a pre-application to develop a 9.4 acre site with a 77,780 square foot neighborhood shopping center including a grocery store, located at the southwest corner of Gonzales Road and Rose Avenue.  
DISCUSSION: The Planning and Environmental Services Manager reviewed the proposed development and the entitlements necessary for this project.

Michael Faulconer, Architect, reviewed the proposed development and stated that this development was designed as a walkable community. The proposed development calls for reduced parkway, sidewalk and landscape setbacks to the buildings.

ACTION: The City Council received report and provided comments.

2. **SUBJECT:** Pre-Application Review of Proposed Development for a Shopping Center with Ancillary Alcohol Sales and Development of a Church Located at the Southwest Corner of Channel Islands Boulevard and Rose Avenue (APN 221-0-232-515), Filed by Tom Davies, Churchyard Development, LLC. (135)

**RECOMMENDATION:** Review and provide preliminary comments on a pre-application to develop a 4.05 acre site with a shopping center and alcohol sales on the northern portion of the site and a church on the southern portion of the site, located at the southwest corner of Channel Islands Boulevard and Rose Avenue.

**DISCUSSION:** The Planning and Environmental Services Manager summarized the proposed development and entitlements necessary for the proposed project. The development consists of a shopping center and church. The development would be built in stages.

Tom Davies, Churchyard Development reviewed the project and stated that the subject property would be divided into three parcels. The northern portion of the site, 2.2 acres would contain a grocery store (1.5 acres) and retail shops (0.7 acres), and the southern portion of the site (1.8 acres) would be developed with a church.

The following individuals expressed concern with the sale of alcohol close to a high school: Nancy Pedersen; Shirley Godwin; Pat Brown and Larry Godwin.

Sandy Smith, representing the applicant, reviewed the project and commented on the proposed store.

**ACTION:** The City Council received the report and provided comments.

3. **SUBJECT:** Cultural Heritage Board Options. (145)

**RECOMMENDATION:** Provide comments and direction to the Planning and Environmental Services Manager on preferred approaches for the preservation and protection of the City's historic and cultural resources.

**DISCUSSION:** The Development Services Director reviewed the City's current cultural heritage program. He reviewed the three options available to implement the City's historic and cultural resources program. They are: 1) designate a new citizen advisory group; 2) designate the Downtown Design Review Committee to act as the City's Historical Board; or 3) continue with the County's Cultural Heritage Board. The Director reviewed each option and the cost to administer the programs.

The following individuals stated their support to continue with the County's Cultural Heritage Board: Michael Faulconer; Nancy Pedersen; Eileen Tracy; Shirley Godwin; Gary Blum; Miguel Fernandez; Pat Brown; and Angela Whitecomb.

**ACTION:** The City Council concurred to continue with the current program.

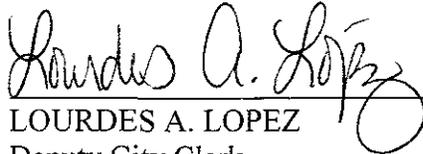
**RECOMMENDATION:** Consider and provide direction to the Public Works Director regarding the Five Year Street Maintenance Capital Improvement Plan.
