Regular Meeting
November 27, 2007

SUBJECT: **Ordinance No. 2760**, Repealing and Reenacting Articles I through IX, XIV, and XV of Chapter 14 of the Oxnard City Code Pertaining to the California Building Code, International Property Maintenance Code, Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings, California Historical Building Code, California Electrical Code, California Existing Buildings Code, California Mechanical Code, California Reference Standards Code, California Plumbing Code, Fire Sprinklers, and Fire Codes (Uniform Codes). (041)
RECOMMENDATION: Second reading and adoption.

2. SUBJECT: Planning and Zoning Permit Nos. 06-570-06 (Zone Change); 05-300-30 (Tentative Parcel Map); and 05-500-27 (Special Use Permit); for the Teal Club Commercial and Industrial Project, Located on the Southeast Corner of Victoria Avenue and Teal Club Road, Filed by Teal Club Investors, L.P. (081)
RECOMMENDATION: (1) Adopt **Resolution No. 13,367** upholding the Planning Commission's approval of Mitigated Negative Declaration No. 2006-05 finding that the proposed project will not have a significant effect on the environment and upholding the Commission's approval of Planning and Zoning Permit 05-500-27 (Special Use Permit) for the construction of a self storage facility with caretaker's unit and new industrial condominium building, subject to certain findings and conditions; (2) Approve the first reading by title only and subsequent adoption of **Ordinance No. 2762** approving Zone Change (Planning and Zoning Permit No. 06-570-06 changing the zone district from Business and Research Park to Light Industrial, Planned Development (M-1-PD) on Parcel Number 3 located on the easterly portion of the project site; and (3) Adopt **Resolution No. 13,368** approving Planning and Zoning Permit No. 05-300-30 (Tentative Parcel Map) to create three parcels for light industrial and future retail/BRP uses*.
