SUBJECT: Second Amendment to Agreement No. 4758-09-PW with King Lee Technologies for Supply and Delivery of Antiscalant to the Water Campus

RECOMMENDATION

That City Council approve and authorize the Mayor to execute a Second Amendment to the Agreement with King Lee Technologies for Supply and Delivery of Antiscalant to the Water Campus to increase the amount from \$198,200 by \$110,787 for a total of \$308,987 and to extend the expiration date to April 6, 2012 (Agreement No. 4218-07-PW).

DISCUSSION

On February 9, 2009, the City's Purchasing Division and Water Resources Division sent out a competitive Request for Bid (RFB) for chemical supply and delivery of antiscalant, used in the reverse osmosis treatment process at the Water Campus Desalter Facility. The RFB was distributed to three (3) regional chemical supply companies, with a closing bid date of March 12, 2009. Out of the three (3) vendors, only King Lee Technologies submitted a bid for antiscalant. Therefore, the City awarded the contract to King Lee Technologies. The original Agreement was from April 7, 2009, through April 6, 2010, with the option for three (3) additional one (1) year periods. The First Amendment to the Agreement increased the value by \$98,100 to \$198,200 and extended the expiration date to April 6, 2011. The proposed Second Amendment would increase the value by \$110,787 to a total of \$308,987, and extend the expiration date to April 6, 2012. Although the antiscalant unit cost will remain the same, the planned approximately 30% increase in Desalter production will require a greater quantity of chemical for the upcoming fiscal year.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Recommended Budget has sufficient funds in Account No. 601-6001 to cover the cost of the Second Amendment.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR TRADE SERVICES

This Second Amendment ("Second Amendment") to the Agreement for Trade Services ("Agreement") is made and entered into in the County of Ventura, State of California, this 17th day of May, 2011, by and between the City of Oxnard, a municipal corporation ("City"), and King Lee Technologies ("Vendor"). This Second Amendment amends the Agreement entered into on April 7, 2009, by City and Vendor. The Agreement previously has been amended on April 1, 2010, by a First Amendment.


City and Vendor agree as follows:
