**SUBJECT:** Rubberized Asphalt Grant Program for Street Resurfacing

**RECOMMENDATION**

That the City Council approve the appropriation of funds in the amount of \$79,955.70 to include \$30,837.30 to the Gonzales Road Resurfacing Project, \$27,013.50 to the Rose Park Neighborhood Resurfacing Project, and \$22,104.90 to the Ormond Beach Neighborhood Project from the Rubberized Asphalt Grant Program.

**DISCUSSION**

On April 22, 2008, the City Council approved Resolution No. 13,402 authorizing the City Manager to submit grant applications to the California State Department of Waste and Recycling (CalRecycle) under the Rubberized Asphalt Grant Program through 2013. The Rubberized Asphalt Grant Program is sponsored by CalRecycle to encourage public agencies to ground recycled tire (crumb) rubber into the hot asphalt mix when resurfacing roadways.

In addition to being environmentally friendly, rubberized asphalt has many other advantages versus conventional asphalt. Rubberized asphalt is durable pavement that resists reflective cracking and can extend the life of a street by 10 years. Rubberized asphalt maintains long-lasting color for striping and markings, is highly skid-resistant and quieter when driven upon. Application of rubberized asphalt has been tested and approved by Caltrans and the Federal Highway Administration.

**FINANCIAL IMPACT**

A Special Budget Appropriation will appropriate \$79,955.70 received from CalRecycle's Rubberized Asphalt Grant Program to reimburse City for the cost of utilizing rubberized asphalt of \$30,837.30 to the Gonzales Road Resurfacing Project, \$27,013.50 to the Rose Park Neighborhood Resurfacing Project, and \$22,104.90 to the Ormond Beach Neighborhood Project.
