SUBJECT: Securitas Central Business District Security Contract, Third Amendment

RECOMMENDATION

That City Council approve and authorize the Mayor to execute a one-year extension in the amount of approximately \$127,541 to the Agreement for security services with Securitas Security Services USA, Inc., 3557-05 PD to continue security services in the Central Business District.

DISCUSSION

In 2005, City Council approved the trade services agreement between Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. to provide security services to the newly renovated Central Business District. This vendor was selected based upon its presence and breadth of experience in working with business improvement districts throughout Southern California. These security services supplemented an increased police presence downtown. This combination of private security and Oxnard Police Department community oriented policing and problem-solving has proven successful.

The security services provided by Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. include foot and bike patrols. Security officers also act as "ambassadors" to the business community and those persons patronizing Central Business District establishments. These security officers also assist police officers with Crime Free Business surveys and the Oxnard Downtown Management District with varied tasks including distributing information business-to-business. The police beat coordinator reports the Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. has provided additional "eyes and ears proving to be an excellent resource" for law enforcement efforts downtown.

The First Amendment to the Agreement expanded security services to include Campus Park while extending the contract. With the demolition of structures at Campus Park nearing completion, there is no longer a need to continue security services there. The Second Amendment to the Agreement extended the agreement through December 31, 2008.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The projected cost of the Agreement is \$127, 541 annually. There are sufficient funds in the Community Development Department to support this agreement.

THIRD AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR TRADE SERVICES

This Third Amendment ("Third Amendment") to the Agreement for Trade Services ("Agreement") is made and entered into in the County of Ventura, State of California, this 1st day of January 2009, by and between the City of Oxnard, a municipal corporation ("City"), and Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. ("Vendor"). This Third Amendment amends the Agreement entered into on August 1, 2005, by City and Vendor. The Agreement previously has been amended on November 1, 2005, by a First Amendment, and by a Second Amendment, on January 1, 2007.


City and Vendor agree as follows:

1. The first sentence in Section 3 of the Agreement is amended to read, "This Agreement shall begin on August 1, 2005, and shall end on December 31, 2009."
2. Exhibit A of the Agreement is amended to read that private security services to the area known as "Campus Park" will cease January 1, 2009.
3. Exhibit B of the Agreement is deleted and replaced with Exhibit B-1 attached hereto and incorporated by this reference in full herein.
4. As so amended, the Agreement remains in full force and effect.






