SUBJECT: **Second Amendment to Agreement A-7142 with California Water Technologies, LLC for Supply and Delivery of Ferric Chloride to the Wastewater Treatment Plant**

RECOMMENDATION

That City Council approve and authorize the Mayor to execute a second amendment to the agreement with California Water Technologies, LLC (Agreement No. A-7142) for supply and delivery of Ferric Chloride SG to the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), to increase the compensation by \$1,155,000 to a total of \$1,679,000.

DISCUSSION

On January 7, 2009, the City's Purchasing Division and Water Resources Division Wastewater Section sent out a competitive Request for Bid (RFB) for chemical supply and delivery of ferric chloride to the WWTP. The RFB was distributed to five (5) regional treatment chemical supply companies with a closing bid date of January 27, 2009. Two (2) of the five (5) vendors responded with bids for ferric chloride: California Water Technologies, LLC and the City's then current supplier, Kemira Water Solutions, Inc. California Water Technologies submitted the lowest bid and was awarded the agreement. The original agreement was for the period from March 10, 2009, through February 28, 2010, and had an option to renew for three (3) additional one (1) year periods. The agreement was amended on February 23, 2010, to extend the expiration date to February 28, 2011.

The City's WWTP utilizes Ferric Chloride, a water treatment chemical, for many treatment related applications. These uses include the control of H₂S formation, which is responsible for odor production, and corrosion of treatment equipment and piping. The WWTPs use of Ferric Chloride has significantly increased over the past two (2) years as a result of higher flows and the need to comply with more stringent regulatory requirements.

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FINANCIAL IMPACT

The cost of services is \$55,000 per month for 21 months; therefore, the Amendment will increase the Agreement compensation by \$1,155,000 for a total not to exceed \$1,679,000. Sufficient funds exist in the FY 2010-11 and FY 2011-12 Budgets, Account No. 621-6202-843-8104 to cover the amendment. Funds will be encumbered as follows:

- \$495,000 in FY 2010-11 for June 2010 through February 28, 2011
- \$220,000 in FY 2010-11 for March 2010 through June 2011
- \$440,000 in FY 2011-12 for July 2011 through February 2012

SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR TRADE SERVICES

2. As so amended, the Agreement remains in full force and effect.




